Appointment process

The Deputy Clinical Lead for EPM UK will be appointed by the EPM UK team under the auspices of the FPM Training and Assessment Committee (FPMTAC). The appointment will be reviewed every 3 years by EPM UK under the auspices of FPMTAC.

All applications should be submitted to the FPM via the email addresses above by the stipulated closing date. Applications received after this date will **not** be eligible for the selection process.

If there is more than one applicant a ballot will be held amongst the EPM UK team and FPMTAC, coordinated by the FPM. A simple majority will suffice and in the event of equality of votes, the chair of EPM UK will have a casting vote (which he or she can delegate). Appointments are made subjection to ratification by the Board of the Faculty.
