Comments:

The APT programme is a rotation between three main sites which complement each other in the range of services offered and patient groups seen. A cancer pain service at Portsmouth includes strong links with palliative care and regular cordotomy and other neurolytic treatment sessions. Solent provides a community based pain management team with a strong psychology and physiotherapy component. Access to specialist hospital services including neuromodulation, spinal MDT and paediatric pain in Southampton University Hospital is offered. Basingstoke has a busy multi-professional pain service with access to spinal MDT clinics and a pain management programme. Anaesthetic on-call commitment is normally based in Portsmouth. Trainees are able to access regular tutorials organised by London PTAG.
